# Logistics of Fishing Pyramid Lake



Aguabonita Flyfisher's first meeting of 2022 will be an inperson presentation by Brad Weich on the Logistics of Pyramid Lake Flyfishing. The meeting will be held at the Ridgecrest United Methodist Church Fellowship Hall (639 N. Norma St., Ridgecrest) beginning at 7:30pm.






Recently, Brad has been focusing more on still water fisheries with Crowley and Pyramid Lake being his favorites.

Word was received recently that Arthur Suppona, long time member and supporter of both the Ridgecrest Aguabonita Flyfishers and the Antelope Valley Flyrodders passed away on March 13, 2020.

Art was born in Brooklyn, New York on February 9, 1920. He joined the Aguabonita Flyfishers in 1984. In November of 1994 both Art Suppona (Antelope Valley Flyrodders) and Chuck Newmyer (Aguabonita Flyfishers) received the DFG prestigious "Wild Trout Volunteer Award".

In 1995 Art received the Southwest Council Federation of Fly Fishers "Conservation Award" for his work on behalf of the Golden Trout Fund, Trout Unlimited, and Department of Fish & Game conservation activities including their electro-shocking projects, fish surveys and other programs.

In the March 2000 issue of the Flyline Art received congratulatory wishes on his 80th birthday with the notation that "He was still enjoying flyfishing too."







Good-Bye to 2021

I think we can all agree, it is great to now see 2021 in the rear view mirror and we can all eagerly look forward to 2022. Hopefully, in 2022 the only shutdown we will see will be a shutdown of all future shutdowns! Since now 2021 is "water under the bridge", hopefully in 2022 we will continue to see "water under the bridge", so that we can all continue to enjoy our flyfishing sport. And speaking of bridges, the new DFG fishing regulations implemented in March of 2021 restricts fishing from Aug. 1st thru Nov. 15th limits fishing on the upper Owens from Benton Crossing Bridge to Crowley Lake to only artificial lures with barbless hooks. (See 104B below.). Previously, bait fishing had been allowed on this stretch of the Owens. Keep this section of river in mind for flyfishing in 2022. Good health and tight lines in 2022.

(61) Hot Creek (Mono Co.). Hot Creek from the State hatchery property line to the confluence with the Owens River.	All year. Only artificial flies with barbless hooks may be used.	0 trout
(104) Owens River (Inyo and Mono cos.), except (A), (B), (C), and (D) below	All year.	5 trout

# In the Background: Don Bowling



I came across this month's background photo on a website article; "13 Top Tips for Winter Fishing at Pyramid Lake" – by Winston Pro Staffer, Scott Flint". The article featured a photograph taken on Pyramid Lake by photographer and guide Arlo Townsend who graciously granted permission for use in this month's Flyline. To me, this photo captures the essence of Winter Flyfishing on Pyramid Lake - i.e. an overlay of dense grey snow-laden clouds covering the tops of lightly dusted slopes. Deep turquoise blue water, with frothy white waves surrounding the intrepid angler, fly rod in hand and to top it all off, a tumbleweed that probably blew in from Ridgecrest.
